


2023 MISSISSIPPI STATE MEETING AT VICKSBURG MS

Vicksburg, MS -- On August 26, 2023, the State Organization of Mississippi of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. held its 32nd Annual Statewide Workshop at the Vicksburg Convention Center. The meeting was hosted by Eta Tau (Vicksburg) and Eta (Alcorn University) Chapters, with Brother Jerry Russ serving as State Marshal. The theme for the meeting was "Building Omega's Legacy by the Bonds of Brotherhood". Over 300 Brothers registered for the event.

During the meeting, Brothers from around the 7th District of Omega Psi Phi transcended upon Vicksburg to handle the business of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. The meeting featured a STEM community service project, an Omega training camp, a park dedication, a Salvation Army community service project, a high school talent hunt competition, a stepshow, a state representative reception, and an OWT on the RIVER social event. Numerous scholarships and chapter recognitions were distributed during the state meeting.

REFLECTIONS BY THE FOUNDER OF OUR NEWSLETTER

It was September 2002. I was fresh out of law school at the University of Mississippi and attending our State Meeting in Tupelo MS. Dr. David Marion had just been elected as our State Representative. Although I did not know him personally, it was obvious he was a very charismatic leader. After the meeting was concluded, I greeted him with a business card, congratulated him on his election, and asked him to contact me if I could be of service to his administration. Upon accepting my business card, he expressed, "I might just do that", with a smile; and he thanked me for my interest in serving.

A couple of weeks later, I received a call from State Representative Marion. He explained that he had two positions available that he wanted to fill. One of those positions was State Director of Public Relations. Because I was an English major at Tougaloo College, I felt that I would be better suited for that particular role. State Representative Marion then asked me to develop a plan to enhance our State in that position. I asked him to give me a week, and I would present him with a proposal. Within a week, I called him back and explained that I wanted to create a newsletter for our state. He expressed his delight with the idea and then asked me for a name for the publication. One of the proposals I submitted to him was "Mississippi Quemunicator", which he approved. Upon advising me to prepare the first issue for our Winter Council Meeting, State Representative Marion explained that if I did an excellent job with the newsletter that he would provide me with a budget to publish the newsletter thereafter.

Over the next several months I wrote letters to chapters around the state soliciting articles for the publication. I then took that information, published a colorful four-page newsletter that was formatted on typing paper, and bound the document with a plastic binder and cover. I made approximately forty copies which I distributed during the Winter Council Meeting of 2023, which was held at the Magnolia Bar Association headquarters in Jackson Mississippi on West Capitol Street. After I passed out the copies of the newsletter, I stood by nervous with anticipation, hoping that the brotherhood would enjoy the product. The Brothers expressed their approval and appreciation for the newsletter. After the meeting, State Representative Marion also expressed his approval of the newsletter and informed me that he would set aside \$300.00 to help cover the cost of publication going forward. Over the next year and a half, three more issues were published for the Mississippi Brotherhood under my authorship.

After serving as State Director of Public Relations for two years, I was elected in 2004 by our Brotherhood as State Counselor. Accordingly, I handed the reigns of publication of our newsletter to Brother Generique "G" Stewart. Over the next couple of decades several editions of the *Mississippi Quemunicator* were published. Unfortunately, over the last several years, the *Mississippi Quemunicator* has lain dormant.

Upon my ascension as State Representative on August 26, 2023, one of the goals I set for this administration was the resurrection of the *Mississippi Quemunicator*. The *Mississippi Quemunicator* is essential to the well-being of our State Organization, for it documents the goals, direction, works, and accomplishments of our State Brotherhood. It serves as the archive of our State Organization; for if we neglect its publication, there are only two outcomes: (1) our history becomes lost to the winds of time due to our failure to document it or (2) someone else writes our history from his/her perspective. Neither of these options is acceptable. Accordingly, it is imperative, going forward, the *Mississippi Quemuniucator* remains a vibrant tool to tell our true story, profile the great men who have been products of our State, and document the significant impact of our Mississippi brotherhood locally, statewide, and internationally. It is in this spirit that I have taken the lead to publish this edition of our *Mississippi Quemunicator*.

Mississippi-wide – The Executive Officers of the State Organization of Mississippi conducted a series of "Regional Roadtrips" throughout Mississippi. Inspired by the guidance of former 7th District Representative and former Mississippi Representative J. B. Carter, the roadtrips were designed to train fraternity brothers on best practices in operations within respective chapters and to allow brothers around Mississippi to become acquainted with their state leadership.

The roadtrip included the following: Region 1 – Tunica, MS (Rosa Fort High School) on November 11, 2023; Region 2 – Holly Springs, MS (Beckley Conference Center) on December 9, 2023, Regions 3 – Canton, MS (Epsilon Kappa Kappa Headquarters) on January 12, 2024; and Region 4 – Hattiesburg, MS (Doubletree by Hilton) on December 16, 2023. Each State Regional Representative was responsible for hosting the roadtrip within his region. Within Mississippi, the regional representatives are as follows: Region 1: Bro. Charles Hall, Region 2: Bro. Daryl Theodore, Region 3: Bro. Creston Burse, and Region 4: Robert "Bob" Whitley.

Topics for the Regional Roadtrip included the mission and vision of the present state administration, importance of reporting chapter events and projects, officer roles and responsibilities, execution of mandated programs, chapter budgeting, protocol and orderly processes, risk management, memorial services, and enhancing chapter public relations.






PSI GAMMA GAMMA'S 35th ANNIVERSARY

PSI RHO AND KAPPA BETA CHAPTERS







IOTA UPSILON CHAPTER


