
Omega Psi Phi Fraternity Recognizes State Stallworth, Sr.

During its 2011 Achievement Week Dinner Theater, held at the Pelican Landing Event Center, the Sigma Alpha Alpha Chapter of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. recognized several key persons for outstanding contributions and/or achievements. State Stallworth, Sr. of Moss Point was recognized for his contributions to civil rights. Mr. Stallworth was a prominent figure in the civil rights activities in Jackson County and spent many years challenging the system in support of equal opportunities. As a result of his actions, the entire landscape for business and finance in Jackson County was altered.

Mr. Stallworth graduated from Pascagoula Negro High School in 1954 and began working at International Paper Company shortly after graduation. He later became president of the International Brotherhood of Pulp, Sulfite, and Paper Mill Workers' union. He was involved in numerous civic activities and served as president of the local NAACP. He was a member of the 1954 Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party and attended the National Democratic Convention in Atlantic City. His involvement put him in touch with such notables as Roy Wilkins, Aaron Henry, Thurgood Marshall, and Medger Evers.

Mr. Stallworth is married to Velma Miller Stallworth and they are the parents of four children.

Rho Alpha Alpha - MLK Prayer Breakfast 2012



CLEVELAND, MS — January 15, 2012 — A capacity crowd filled the Senator's Place in Cleveland recently to hear the inspiring words of civil rights legend Ronald Dellums. Ronald Vernie "Ron" Dellums served as Oakland California's forty-fifth mayor. From1971 to 1998, he was elected to thirteen terms as a Member of the U.S. House of Representatives from Northern California's 9th Congressional District, after which he worked as a lobbyist in Washington D.C.

Dellums was born into a family of labor organizers, and enlisted in the United States Marine Corps before serving on the Berkeley, California, City Council. Dellums was the first African American elected to Congress from Northern California. Rho Alpha Alpha Chapter of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. was recognized at the event for their work with the Academics Count Too (ACT) Campaign. The ACT Campaign is a program sponsored by Solomon Chapel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Cleveland designed to help prepare students to take the college entrance examination. The ACT test assesses high school students' general educational development and their ability to complete college-level work. The multiple-choice tests cover four skill areas: English, mathematics, reading, and science. The Writing Test, which is optional, measures skill in planning and writing a short essay.
